# State and Federal Cost Share Programs

Through partnerships between USDA, Natural Resources Conservation Service, Farm Service Agency, ODNR, Division of Soil and Water, Ohio Public Works Commission, and the Pickaway Soil and Water Conservation District, State and Federal cost share programs have distributed over 2.0 million dollars to cooperators in Pickaway County during 2013 for installed Best Management Practices (BMPs). The programs include Conservation Reserve Program, Scioto River Watershed Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program, Environmental Quality Incentive Program, wildlife Habitat Incentive Program, and annual conservation program rental payments.

### **Educational Program**

The District's Education Program provided 1017 hands-on presentations to over 4000 youth demonstrating environmental issues and conservation of natural resources.

Other programs provided were: Cub Scouts, 4-H, home schools, Science Clubs, and other special events reaching additional youth and adult. The District sponsors the annual Area Five Envirothon, an outdoor natural resource education competition for High School students.

The District provides natural resource materials through its lending program including a Forestry Trunk, a Stream Quality Monitoring Trunk, Stream Table Model, Groundwater Model, the Enviroscape Model, and the Soil Tunnel. The District's web site, www.pickawayswcd.org, provides a portal to the internet through educational links.




