Election Notice and Procedures

Five county residents serve as supervisors on the Pickaway SWCD Board. Each supervisor serves a three-year term and may run for re-election at the end of their term. Current board members are: Matt Anderson, chair; Steve Hawkins, vice chair; Barbara Martindale, secretary; Clyde Ohnewehr, treasurer; and Bill Black, member/fiscal agent. The Board of Supervisors guide the staff and partnering agencies in efforts to implement conservation programs which address management and conservation of soil, water and related resources.

Barbara Martindale and Jonathon Lohstroh have accepted the nomination to run for the Pickaway SWCD Board of Supervisors. The one elected supervisor will begin his/her term January 1, 2019. The Pickaway SWCD Annual Supervisor Election will be held from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, September 11, 2018. Voters will have the opportunity to cast their vote in the privacy of a booth in the foyer of Emmett Chapel United Methodist Church, located at 318 Tarlton Road, Circleville. Voters do not have to attend the meeting to cast a vote. Results of the election will be announced during the evening's program.

Firms, Corporations, LLC's, trusts and non-residents that own land or occupy land in Pickaway County must provide an affidavit of their eligibility, which includes designation of a voting representative, prior to casting a ballot. Affidavit forms are available at the District office and on the District's website. Anyone wishing to vote by absentee ballot must complete an absentee ballot application. If voting by mail, the application must be received in the District's office between August 21 and September 5. If voting at the District office you must do so between August 21 and 3 p.m. on September 11.

Applications for absentee ballots will be available at the Pickaway SWCD office between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday–Friday, and on the website at www.pickawayswcd.org beginning August 21. Absentee ballots will not be accepted at the meeting. Please call the office at 740-477-1693 with any questions.



Jonathon Lohstroh


